

Java applet errors

E_PKI_NOT_INSTALLED

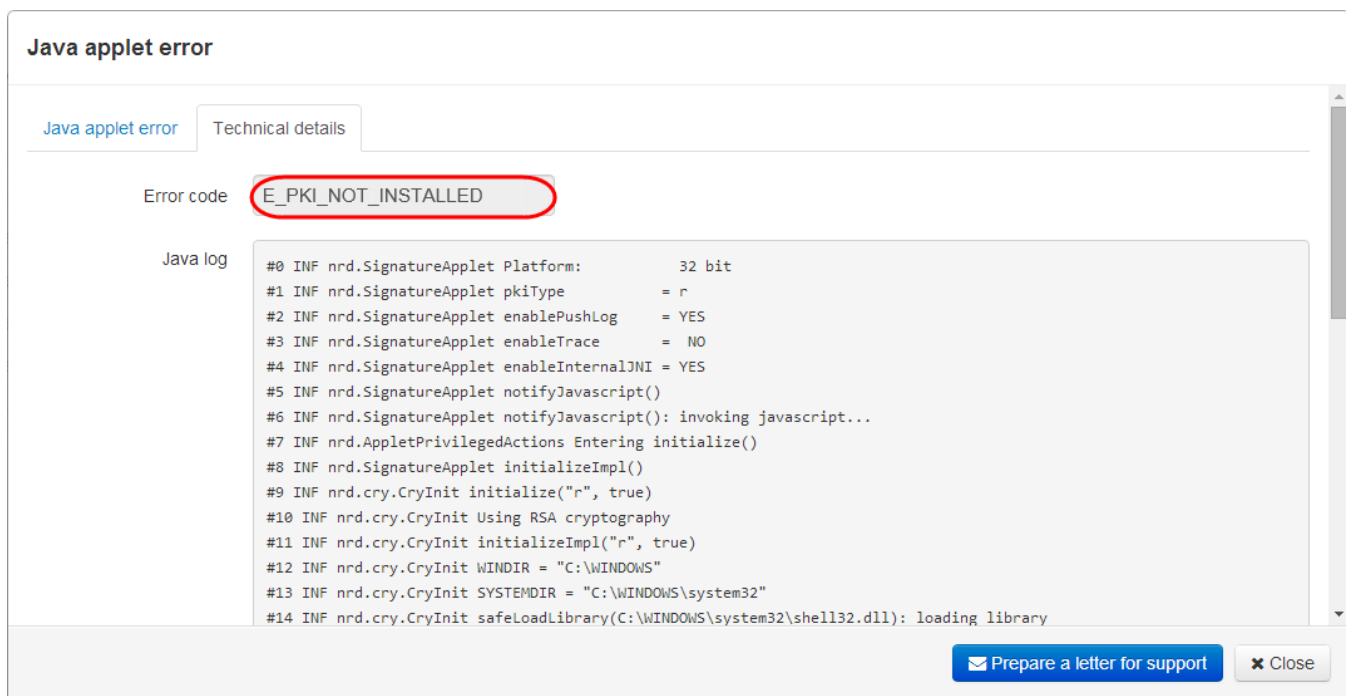


Fig. 1 – Certificates storage is not installed

In case of error with code E_PKI_NOT_INSTALLED (Fig. 1) while working in the Web-client, for example, It means that:

- the Certificates storage is not installed;
- the 32-bit Certificates storage is not installed on the 64-bit OS.

You need to install the 32-bit Certificates storage to work with certificates, regardless of the bitness of your OS. Additionally, an installation of 64-bit Certificate directory is required if you are using the 64-bit OS. [Install Certificates storage](#)

E_JNI_NOT_INSTALLED

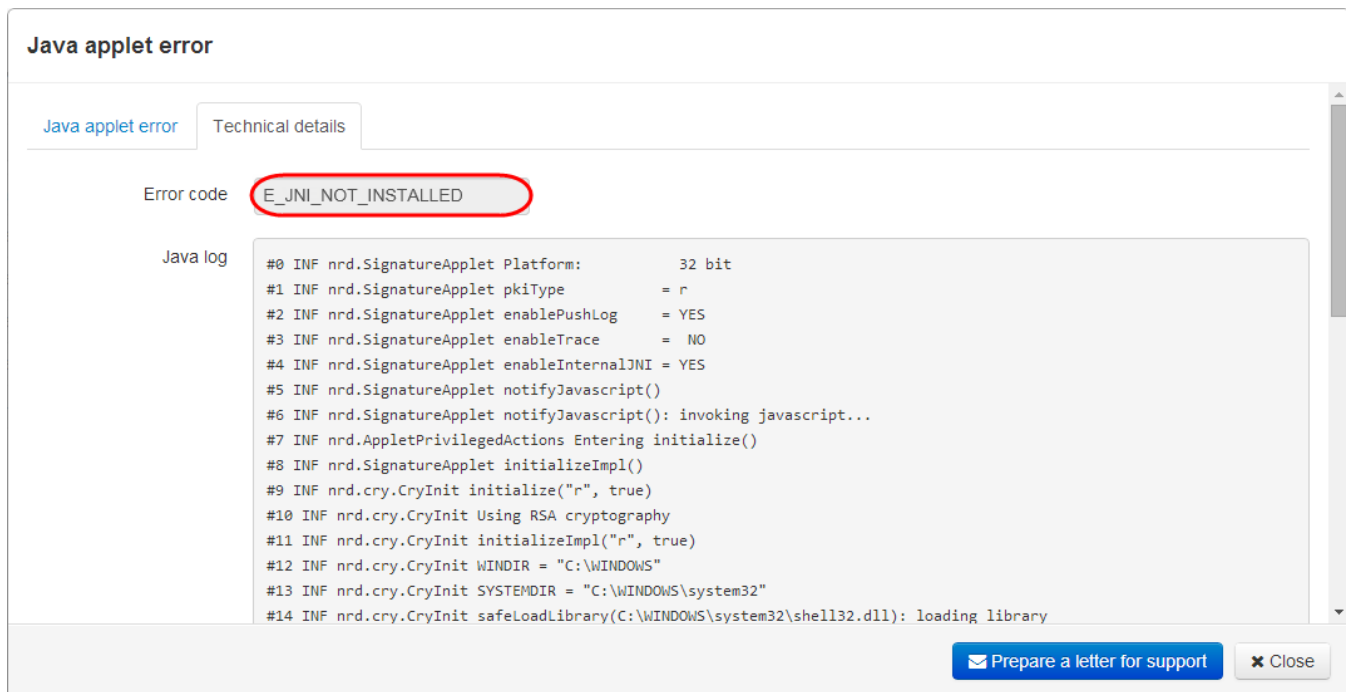


Fig. 2 – Java API is not installed

Error E_JNI_NOT_INSTALLED (Fig. 2) occurs when the Java API is not installed. [Install Java API](#)
